



REOPENING GUIDELINES FOR PRE-K TO LOWER PRIMARY






Transportation

- Buses will run at half capacity (50%) with seat marks for seating guidance
- Temperature screening upon entry
- All bus riders to wear masks
- Seat/seat belt/handles/swipe machines will be sanitized after every use.
- If symptoms are displayed in the bus, the person will be kept 2m away from all students
- Drop off symptomatic student first. If going to school move them to isolation.
- If +ve COVID then contact tracing will be done with 14 day quarantine.



Entry/Pick-up/School Visits

- Thermal Screening for all
- Masks for children above 2 years
- Designated separate entry and exit
- Only one parent inside the school for a max of 10 min for drop off/pick up
 - Via Gate 4
 - Must carry Parent ID card



Screening, Contingency & Emergency

- Health & Safety Officer designated
- If +ve case is discovered, contact tracing will be carried out with 14 day quarantine
- Full PPE suit for medical staff and staff managing isolation cases
- Return to school will be permitted only on clearance certificate by DHA
- Health & Travel declaration forms are mandatory for all staff, students and parents





School Clinic

- School Clinic is compliant with the latest DHA Guidelines
- Clinic has separate isolation room, examination room & adequate medical supplies
- Strict disinfection & infection control measures are followed in the school clinic
- Teachers to inform clinic to ask if they may proceed to send a student to clinic. Student will be permitted as per the Clinic occupancy at the time. Emergencies exempted.
- Students must obtain a clinic pass from teachers prior to coming to the clinic. Emergencies exempted
- 1:1 nurse/ patient will be followed in the clinic.
- Isolation Room has been set up for the suspected and potentially infectious cases.
- Adequate number of PPEs are available in the clinic to practice best infection control measures.
- Parents to be advised to collect children within 30 minutes of being called this is to minimize their exposure to a hazardous environment.
- Child should stay home when he/she is having any of the following signs/symptoms:
 - Temperature 37.5°C or more
 - Respiratory symptoms like cough ,runny nose, nasal congestion, sore throat, shortness of breath
 - Loss of taste / loss of smell
 - Vomiting/ Diarrhea
 - Skin rashes
 - Red and watery eyes
 - Headache & body ache
 - Generalized feeling of being unwell



School Clinic

- Medical Clearance Certificate should be submitted on returning to school in case of infection.
- If a child/teacher/staff begins to show symptoms of COVID-19 while at school, they will be isolated instantly, and the parent/ guardian of the child to be notified immediately and the patient should be referred to the hospital to take the necessary action. The patient should not return to school until the Negative PCR result and medical clearance letter is obtained and submitted to School Clinic.
- Student with chronic medical illnesses or reduced immunity to opt for distant learning.
 In case of face to face learning, medical clearance certificate that states that it is safe for them to be present on campus should be submitted to the school clinic. In the absence of such a certificate, they will not be allowed on campus.



Physical distancing/Set up

- Minimum 1.5m distance in class and 2m everywhere else.
- Use of outside space for PE shaded area, sports is encouraged with 2 m distancing
- Isolation rooms designated for suspected cases
- Markers on floor for social distancing



Hygiene

- Common areas (toilets, pantry, etc.) will be sanitized every hour or after every use
- Complete sanitization is ongoing
- Daily sterilization of full school
- Children are expected to come to school in their designated uniforms. These must be washed after each use.
- Touch points will be disinfected after every touch throughout the school
- Non-contact wall-mounted sanitizers with sensors
- Staff and children's bags will be sprayed with sanitizer
- Paperless strategy. Technology will be used to avoid contact, but students will bring their own stationery kits
- All staff attending ongoing training in contact-tracing etc.
- Extra masks must be carried





Restrictions

- Students and Staff with medical conditions are exempted from mask (medical certificate required)
- Staff in direct contact with children (KG/SEND) should wear face shields.
- Registration to be done online and school tours only through appointments. No walk-ins.
- No physical field-trips, camps etc.

Resources/Materials

- Students and teachers to bring own stationary and gadgets.
- No sharing will be allowed.
- No musical instruments will be used.
- Cloth materials, furniture, carpets have been removed.
- Extra curricular activities (PACT) synchronous online classes only
- Indoor soft play areas, reading corners with furniture will not be used.



Education Provision

- Student ratio 10 students per class in KG, 15 students in Lower Primary.
- Minimum 1.5m distance will be maintained
- As far as possible same teacher and staff for each learning group.
- Each student will have their own designated table and chair, no swapping allowed.
- Pediatric first aid and CPR trained staff.
- Students and staff with high risk condition (illness or immunocompromised) will be offered online provision.





Classroom/ Individual Learning Space Set Up

- Maximum 10 students per class.
- Individual tables placed 1.5m apart, from other children.
- · Bags stored under their individual tables.
- The cubbies in class will not be used.
- Students will carry their stationery every day.

Books Grades 1 & 2





Devices

KG - No devices should be brought to school. You will be informed when to send the device with your child.

Grade 1 & 2 - All children will need to bring in their device daily. Kindly ensure that it is fully recharged everyday and clearly labelled with the student's name, class and section.

Students will use their own wet-wipes to sanitize their device, when they remove it from their bag. They should sanitize again at the end of the school day before they put in in their bag to bring home.



Food & Beverages

- Pre-packed food only
- Parents encouraged to send food with plastic container.
- Students to carry enough water for the day.
 Water dispensers have been removed.
 However water vending machines are available for purchase.
- Disposable containers and cutleries
- No canteen service
- The children will eat their snacks in the classroom.
 Their areas where they will eat will be sanitized before and after they eat.



Physical Education

- Swimming pools closed
- Indoor soft play areas closed
- PE will not be strenuous, so masks will be worn at all times
- 1.5m distancing in PE lesson with visible markers on floor
- All equipment will be sanitized after every use and at the end of the day
- No tournaments allowed



Washroom protocols

- Use a tissue when touching any surfaces.
- Wash hands thoroughly with soap and water after using the washroom.
- Use sanitizer.





Teaching

- Teachers will use a headset
- Teaching screen will be shared
- Classkick and Phoenix will actively be used for submission of work.
- Online feedback and next steps to support each child's development.





CURRICULUM

- Music, Dance and Art lessons will take place in the classroom.
 Videos will be shared for the students who are attending online.
- Genius Hours and PE lessons will be asynchronous lessons take
 place outdoors, in a shaded area. Students will participate in
 activities and teachers will ensure that they are socially distanced
 by 1.5m, while avoiding contact with each other.
- Assessments will be ongoing:
 - KG via EvidenceMe
 - Grade 1 & 2 End of Unit, as per the assessment structure

PACT

- Activities will be conducted through Microsoft Teams (synchronous)
- 3 days a week
- Students will choose one activity per day for Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.
 - The activity chosen for the student will remain the same throughout the academic year.
 - PACT activities will happen from 1:30 to 3:30 pm on these days.
 - Seats are limited to 25 per activity. Once the maximum number is reached, the activity will be automatically closed from the online system.
 - In case of permanent / temporary withdrawals, the mail should reach the Primary PACT Coordinator
 - Ms. Deepti Arora <u>deepti.a nms@gemsedu.com</u> with a copy to the homeroom teacher and the concerned PACT teacher.

Please remind your child to:

- Wear a mask at all times
- Carry extra masks and gloves.
- Dispose masks/ gloves responsibly in the bins provided.
 - Do not share any of your belongings with any one.
 - Maintain social distancing at all times.
 - Wash your hands or sanitize frequently.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

My children have not been able to fly back to Dubai in time to rejoin school. Can they attend classes online? Yes, they can attend the classes online.

Can we opt for distance learning, if we had chosen 'Blended Learning' in the survey?

Yes, you can opt for distance learning on all 5 days, by mailing the Homeroom Teacher. The option to change from 5 days of Distance Learning to Blended Learning is not allowed.

Is there an allocated distributor for stationery or do you have a preferred shop or online platform?

You may buy the stationery from anywhere. Stationery or books are not available on school premises.

Is remote PACT for all the students?

PACT is only available for Lower Primary students and not Kindergarten.

Where can we get the students ID cards from?

ID cards will be distributed to those students who are attending school, as of now.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

If a student tests positive while in school, will the whole class be quarantined?

Yes. As per regulations from DHA, all parents will be informed and 14 day quarantine period will ensue. Students will be permitted back to school once they have a negative result from DHA.

Is it required for KG children to bring tablets or iPads to school during the Blended Learning program?

Our first priority is for students to settle down and enjoy coming to school. Thus, please do not send any devices on the first day. We will inform you of when to send it.

Does Pre-KG have uniforms?

Pre-K students have colour-dress days. The Homeroom Teacher will inform you of the colours that your child can wear on specific days. There is no school uniform for Pre-KG students. However, they must be toilet-trained to avoid contact with an adult to change the diaper.
